ENGL 4564-001 Early Romantics: Other Worlds MWF 1:00-1:50 PM HUMN 1B90 Rangarajan

In this course we'll be studying a variety of texts from the late eighteenth and nearly nineteenth centuries, a tumultuous, revolutionary literary and historical period now known as the Romantic era. We will study a variety of canonical and lesser-known texts across the period with an emphasis on the Romantic penchant for the exotic and the supernatural. In effect, we'll be studying how the Romantics understood other worlds in relation to their own, and how they used literature to mediate these relationships. The writing for this course will consist of two longer papers and one exam.
